Magic Media – Media Magic

Video Art since the 1970s from the Wulf-Herzogenrath-Archive

Since the 1970s, Wulf Herzogenrath, Akademie member and long-time director of Kunsthalle Bremen, has made a decisive contribution as an art historian and curator to the establishment of video art in Germany. His archive, which is in part held by the Akademie der Künste and in part privately owned, not only contains highlights from video art, but also reflects the entire range of artistic production and thus the history of video art from its beginnings in the 1960s to the present day.

In the ***Magic Media – Media Magic*** exhibition, the Akademie der Künste will show artistic and documentary film material, documents, sketches, photographs and artist guest books from the curator's collection by **Vito Acconci, Klaus vom Bruch, John Cage, peter campus, Lutz Dammbeck, Mathilde ter Heijne, Rebecca Horn, Joan Jonas, Bjørn Melhus, Marcel Odenbach, Nam June Paik, Ulrike Rosenbach, Bill Viola and Raphaela Vogel**, among others, as well as on **Kölner Projekt'74** and **documenta 6**.

In addition, based on a selection of small-format original folios and prints (including by Marcel Duchamp, Viking Eggeling, Max Ernst, Marcel Jean, Yves Klein, Kazimir Malevič, Christian Schad and Andy Warhol), Wulf Herzogenrath will present his statement on the history of art in the 20th century, describing the path into the digital era.

As part of Berlin Art Week / In cooperation with Videoart at Midnight.

About the exhibition

As a curator, Wulf Herzogenrath made a crucial contribution to the establishment of video art in Germany. His archive, which is partly held by the archives of the Akademie der Künste and partly in his private possession, contains many highlights of video art and sculpture since the 1960s. But more than that, the archive contains a treasure trove of written material, documents, sketches, photographs, and his legendary artists' guest books, which document artistic production and the history of video art to this day.

For the very first time, Wulf Herzogenrath presents a visual statement that gives insights into art historical and curatorial thought processes: using a selection of small-format original papers and prints, he reflects on art as it focuses on the reality of the original on the one hand and the copy on the other. These choices and ideas have had an enormous influence on his work on media art. The opening of his Akademie der Künste archives was celebrated in December 2018 with an exhibition as part of the *Videoart at Midnight* festival. The new exhibition *Magic Media – Media Magic* shows video art, sculpture and installations by international artists from this unique collection, including important milestones for the development of media art.

In the 1960s, visual artists discovered the immediate availability of video images and began using technology that was originally developed for television. Video art as a genre was first presented, in surprising breadth, at the Cologne *Projekt '74*, with the work of 95 international artists. Wulf Herzogenrath then curated the "Video" section of the documenta 6 (1977) in the Fridericianum building, which contained a video library that provided 60 art videotapes for use. In these early years of video art, the focus was on the observation of one's own body with performances and the interference of the perception of space and time. But in the 1980s, artists began developing new technical ways of manipulating the electronic image and sound structure in order to change the aesthetics of visual imagery and perception. Then access to digital image production and processing in the 1990s opened up further dimensions, by offering the chance to incorporate diverse vintage and documentary material, modern everyday and standard images, as well as fiction/non-fiction, into artistic processes and film collages.


